

Vickie Reynolds' Black Magic Cross



Vickie writes: "As far as adapting Mary's wonderful pattern for the cross, I mentally analyzed and picked apart the various elements of her design and then put them back together on paper in a different fashion. (I'm much too analytical for my own good! hehe) To me, it seemed logical that the separate parts could be put together to make a shape with corners and I could get a cross out of it. Of course, until I got it all on paper, I wasn't sure it would work!

After I realized the cross would fly, the earrings were a shoe-in. If I tell you, "I saw them




in my mind's eye," does that make any sense? I seem to have this place in my brain where I can see an entire concept and then just "know" how to make it happen. I can't explain it very well, and I probably sound "quite daft" as Jane or Mary would say, but there ya have it!

Abbreviations:

DS double stitch

CH chain

- picot

+ join

CL close ring

RW reverse work

DNRW do not reverse work

SS switch shuttles

SJ shuttle join

Ring A (RA): 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3, CL, RW

Ring B (RB): 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3, CL, DNRW, SS

Petal 1 (P1):

Ch 6, RW

R of 3 - 3 - 5, CL, RW

Ch 3+ (to last free picot of CC1) 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3, SJ (to 2nd picot of previous ring) make an extra small (tiny) picot, 6, SJ (to next free picot of Ring A)

Petal 2 (P2):

Ch 6, RW

R of 3-3-5, CL, RW

Ch 3+ (to extra small tiny picot of previous petal) 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3, SJ (to 2nd picot of

previous ring) make an extra small (tiny) picot, 6, SJ (to next free picot of Ring A)

Connecting chain 1 (CC1): Ch 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 6, RW

Connecting chain 2 (CC2): Ch 6+ (to extra small tiny picot) 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 - 3 + (to base of initial ch 3 at RB), cut, tie and hide ends.

RB, CC1,RA, P1, P2 (6 times), CC2
