
TATINGYOKE

PATTERN WINS \$2.

A very pretty yoke in tatting is made as follows:

Commence at lower point of scallop with a r of S ds, p, Z ds, p, S ds, close; ch 2 ds, (p, 2 ds) 10 times. R, join by first p to last p of preceding r, ch of (2 ds, p) S times, S ds, r, join by first p to second p of last r. Ch S ds, r. (all rings are made the same way). ch of S ds, r. ch S ds, join to last p



of preceding long chain. (2 ds. p) 8 times, 2 ds. r. join as before to preceding r, ch (2 ds, p) 8 times, 2 ds. r. join as before to preceding r.

Ch S ds. p. (2 ds. p) & times, S ds.
