

# Antique Scalloped Edging Adapted to modern tatting techniques By Linda S Davies © 2008

#### Materials:

Size 20 tatting cotton in the colours of your choice. The whole of the edging is worked with 2 shuttles.

#### Method:

Top row of small blocks.

Wind both shuttles with CTM until both are about half full.

Ch 1 - 4, SLT, TWO

- 4 ↓, SLT, TWO

4 ↓, 1 DNTWO

This forms the first small block, rep for the required length. The amount must be divisible by 6 minus 1.

#### Middle row of SCMRs

Wind both shuttles with CTM unitl both are guite full.

SCMR 3 - 3 + (to first block on prev row) 3 - 3 cl RW

SCMR 6 - 6 - 6 - 6 cl RW

Ch 4 DNRW

SCMR 3 + 3 +(to next block on prev row) 3 - 3 cl RW

SCMR 6 + 8 + 8 + 6 cl RW

Ch 4 DNRW

SCMR 3 + 3 +(to next block on prev row) 3 - 3 cl RW

SCMR 6 + 10 + 10 + 6 cl RW

Ch 4 DNRW

SCMR 3 + 3 +(to next block on prev row) 3 - 3 cl RW

SCMR 6 + 8 + 8 + 6 cl RW

Ch 4 DNRW

SCMR 3 + 3 +(to next block on prev row) 3 - 3 cl RW

SCMR 6 + 6 - 6 - 6 cl RW

Ch 7 + (to next block on prev row) 7 DNRW

Rep to the end of the prev row.

### Bottom row of large blocks.

Wind both shuttles with CTM until both are quite full.

\*Ch 1 - 5, SLT, TWO

Ch - 5 ↓, SLT, TWO

Ch - 5 ↓, SLT, TWO

Ch - 5 ↓, SLT, TWO

Join to first free p on prev row, Ch  $5 \downarrow$ .

Rep from \* joinging each block to next free p on prev row to end.
