
Imported Designs of Tatting Book #77, 1936

With a clear photo and a numbered diagram, the tatter can recreate all the patterns in this book, "Imported Designs of Tatting #77" easily. This booklet was published with photos of the tatting only. No instructions, no patterns.

Insertions #8138 and #8141

Both of these patterns are edgings which may stand alone. They have been made into insertions by joining two lengths across by means of the large rings of each cloverleaf.

#8138, the repeat *R 5 - 5 + 2 + 2 - 5 - 5 clr dnrw Leave no space between rings R 5 + (join to previous ring)5 - 2 - 2 - 5 - 5 clr dnrw R 5 + (join to previous ring)5 - 2 - 2 - 5 - 5 clr rw CH 10 - 10 R 5 - 5 - 2 + 2 + 5 - 5 clr rw Repeat from * For insertion join the 2nd and 4th picots of the large rings to opposite side.

All three rings of cloverleaf 10 - 10; rings unjoined at sides, rw. CH 5 - 5 - 5 - 5 rw The side rings of each preceding cloverleaf join at mid point to the next side ring.

For insert ion the large ring of the cloverleaf joins into this same join making three rings in one join.
