

## Night Owl Class. A Little Owl ©Barbara Payne. Taught by Riet Surtel-Smeulders.



Here you see little owls as earrings. It is an easy pattern, but it is very cute. The earrings are tatted with thread #80.

But for the night owl class I think we can use it in different ways. With thread #80 we can tat earrings, but also without the silverbeads and hanger, little owls to be put on cards. You can draw a part of a tree and put the owls on the branches. You can tat the tree, and put the owls in it. You can tat a whole family, just think how. In other words, at the end of the class I would like it to see all the different things that you can make with this pattern. So take the challenge and show what all you can tat. The only thing that must be on your card is the owl. You are allowed to use all kinds of materials.

NB - For 2 earrings you will need 4 size 11 beads for the eyes, plus 6-10 different colored beads for attaching the owls to the findings. This pattern is just 1 ring with a very long chain.

Here is the pattern for the little owl earrings. This is my first pattern so I am not sure I have done everything correct. Please let me know if there are any errors or places where it is unclear what to do. These are also cute in white for snow owls! This is a really easy pattern and I hope you enjoy it!!

You will need:

- 1 shuttle
- size 80 thread in desired color
- 2 size 11 seed beads for eyes
- hook for joining picots
- 3-5 seed beads
- 2 earring findings

- very long picot
- long picot
- picot
- small picot
- very small picot
- B bead
- R ring
- Ch chain
- RW reverse work
- LJ lock join
- DS double stitch

R: 2DS B 2DS – 2DS – 2DS B 2DS close ring and RW

Ch: 1DS ----- 5 DS – 9DS LJ to first picot of ring, continue with chain

2DS ---- 1DS --- 1DS – 1DS – 3DS – 1DS – 1DS – 2DS – 1DS – 1DS – 3DS – 1DS – 1DS --- 1DS ---- 2DS

LJ to 2nd picot of ring 9DS – 5DS LJ to base of ring cut, tie and hide ends.

Thread 3-5 seed beads on long picot at base of ring then attach earring finding
