Multi Beaded Earring – 2009 © Jane Eborall





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
The length of these earrings can easily be extended by adding to the chains and the first long beaded picot. For adding beads to the centre of a ring <u>see this link</u> and to the centre of a split ring <u>see this link</u>.

Materials required. Beads. 40 seed beads (size 11), 2 measuring $\frac{1}{8}$ " (centre of ring2 & SR4) and one large one measuring $\frac{1}{4}$ ". All measurements are approximate. 2 shuttles and a metal split ring.

Please note that the beads on the chain are moved along the **CORE** thread into place. Add 1 B to Sh1 thread. Add 12 beads (for the chain) followed by 3 beads (same as Sh1) to Sh2 thread before starting.


Throughout this pattern italics and red text show indicate back side tatting. On the diagrams the red numbers refer to the number of the chain numbers in the text.

R5: 4 LBP (add beads to the thread (I used 1 seed, one $\frac{1}{4}$ ", 1 seed), take previous LBP through the loop at the end and snug the new LBP to lie between beads 10 & 11) 4 Cl SS. See fig. 4

Ch: 2 MB 1 + (LBP) 1 MB 2 B M2 MB 2 MB 2 MB 2 RW *R6:* 4 + B (R4) 3 + (space btwn next 2 centre B's) 3 + B (SR2) 4 Cl T & C**Please note.** I haven't drawn all the seed beads on the VLP.
