
Nellie's Earring

Based on Motif No. 20 in <u>Forty Original Designs in</u>
<u>Tatting</u> by Nellie Hall Youngburg, adapted by Martha Ess

In Nellie's original pattern, she makes the center ring and then cuts and ties, before starting over to make the outer portion. Of course, we don't want to do it that way. It is easy to throw off a ring from a chain and make it in one pass.

Basic version: 2 shuttles wound CTM

R: 4 - 4 - 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 4 SSh

R: MP 4 - 4 - 4 clr SSh

Ch: 4 RW

R: 4 + (to adj R) 4 - 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 8 RW

[R: 4 + (prev R) 4 - 4 - 4 clr] 3 times, RW

Ch: 8 RW

R: 4 + (prev R) 4 - 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 4 + (to center R) 4 RW

R: 4 + (to adj R) 4 - 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 8 RW

[R: 4 + (prev R) 4 - 4 - 4 clr] 3 times, RW



To make it an earring: My friend Stephanie thought this would be a good pattern to add beads and turn into an earring. It's easy to put beads where the picots are. Beads on the shuttle thread can be moved into position to take the place of unjoined picots. A bead can be slipped over a picot when joining to it. But what to do about that mock picot? I decided to move up one bead before making the center ring, and another bead before moving back to the chain. Since this gives the appearance of 2 beads on a joined picot, I added 2 beads to the other picots of the center ring. When joining there, you need to be careful that the join lies between the beads. Also, I added 3 beads to the bottom corners, and 6 beads to the top corner for a loop for the earring finding.



Beaded Version: 2 shuttles wound CTM, with 24 beads on Shuttle 1 and 6 beads on Shuttle 2. Have 15 more beads standing by to add to joined picots. Except for joins to the center ring, place a bead on each picot when you join to it.

R: (1 bead on ring thread around hand) 4 - 4 B 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 4 Switch shuttles. Move up one bead from Shuttle 2 so it lies between the chain and

the ring you are about to make.

R: (4 beads on ring thread around hand) MP 4 BB 4 BB 4 clr. Move up bead from

Shuttle 2 so it lies between the ring just made and the next chain. Switch shuttles

Ch: 4 RW

R: (1 bead on ring thread) 4 +B (to adj R) 4 B 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 8 RW

R: (1 bead on ring thread) 4 +B (prev R) 4 B 4 - 4 clr RW

R: (3 beads on ring thread) 4 +B (prev R) 4 BBB 4 - 4 clr RW

R: (1 bead on ring thread) 4 +B (prev R) 4 B 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 8 RW

R: (1 bead on ring thread) 4 +B (prev R) 4 B 4 - 4 clr RW

Ch: 4 + (to center R betw beads) 4 RW



Ch: 8. Cut and tie to base of 1st R
